Presenters and Topics:

TITLE: Compensable Dental and TMJ Industrial Injuries

Presenter: Dr. Moshe Benarroch, DMD, QME, Board-Certified Periodontist



Upon completion of the presentation, the attendee will understand common dental and TMJ issues arising from a work-related injury. Specifically, they will learn how chronic pain and stress arising from orthopedic, psychiatric, and internal medicine industrial injuries can aggravate or cause bruxism, myofascial pain, xerostomia, TMJ pain, caries, and periodontal disease and how these conditions can cause ratable impairments per the 5th Edition of the AMA Guides. They will also learn about medication-induced xerostomia, which can cause a multitude of issues for their dental and periodontal health.

Learning Outcomes: At the end of this presentation, attendees will be able to:

1. Describe how to effectively screen and identify dental and TMJ issues that may arise from a work-related injury.
2. Recognize some common dental and TMJ conditions that arise from chronic pain and stress.
3. Explain how medications can change the quantity and quality of saliva and its impact on teeth, gingival tissues, ability to eat, and ability to speak.

TITLE: Getting Finger and Partial Hand Amputees Back to Work

Presenter: Paola Maite Navarro from Naked Prosthetics



The functional loss and psychological impact of fingers or partial hand amputation are devastating. This session will review the functional prosthetic solutions for these conditions. We will also discuss the physical, psychological, and financial effects amputations have on patients. Lastly, we will review case studies of patients who could return to work after their amputations. Attendees will be able to examine some of the customized functional prostheses.

Learning Outcomes: At the end of this presentation, attendees will be able to:

1. Identify how recent advancements in manufacturing technology and engineering advancements led to the development and availability of novel, functional prosthetic devices and the need for a new standard of care for persons with finger and partial-hand amputations.
2. Recognize the physical and psychological effects after traumatic finger and partial-hand amputation as compared to other persons experiencing other traumatic amputations.
3. Compare the percentage of finger amputations to that of other upper extremity amputations while reviewing the potential long-term economic ramifications to this amputee population.

TITLE: Maintaining Independence After Vision Loss

Presenter: Natalie Duarte de Escalante from Long Beach VA Blind Rehab. Center

Vision impairment through injury, illness, and/or disease processes can impact one's quality of life, independence, and mobility. It can also lead to social isolation and other aspects of their mental wellbeing. This course will provide the participants with information about the different types of vision loss. The participants will understand the difference between legal blindness and low vision. Blind Rehabilitation Training will be explained, as well as how to refer someone for Blind Rehabilitation. Finally, information about various community resources that work with people who are blind or visually impaired will be presented.



Learning Outcomes: At the end of this presentation, attendees will be able to:

1. Identify what blind rehabilitation is and who can benefit from it.
2. Describe what the specialties are within blind rehabilitation.
3. Name three adaptive devices for people who are blind or visually impaired.
4. Recognize community agencies for people who are blind or visually impaired and how to refer to them.
